

OZONA, TEXAS

The biggest little town in the world

zona, Texas, is the only town in Crockett County. The county was named in 1875 by the Fourteenth Legislature of Texas in honor of Colonel David Crockett, who died fighting in the defense of the liberties of Texas at the Alamo in 1836.

A sea once covered this land, situated in the Edwards Plateau Region and shaped by slow sculpturing winds and rains of a million yeas that covered deep valleys and draws, and left rim rocks and mesas at the same level. But long periods of thirst, more than anything



else, fashioned the landscape, the economy, the growth, and even the physical forms of plant and animal life.

Crockett County is the eighth largest county in the state of Texas, with more than 1,800,000 acres, of which more than 93 percent is privately owned. The population of Ozona numbers just more than 4,000. Overall tax rates in the county are low because Ozona is unincorporated—there is no city government and no hospital or municipal urban development district to levy a tax. Ozona is a major sheep, and Angora goat-producing county, with some cattle income. Approximately 93 percent of the land is in farm and ranches, with less than 1 percent of this in harvested cropland and less than 1 percent irrigated. Hunting is a major income for property owners, and visitors fly into our local airport from all around the country.



You will find beautiful parks and monuments touting our history. Stunning colony-style homes rose along "Silk Stocking Row" during one of the first oil booms, in the 1920s. View a number of period exhibits at the Crockett County Museum.

Stop by the Ozona Chamber of Commerce and Visitor Center Park to stretch your legs, and for information about lodging, dining, and any numer of local services.

Something for everyone to enjoy

he state of Louisiana is full of history, and Morehouse Parish is no exception. Almost 200 years ago, an Indian trader, Francois Bonaventure, settled at Point Pleasant on Bayou Bartholomew, just outside the present city limits of Bastrop. On that day in 1785, the recorded history of Bastrop and Morehouse Parish began.

When the Spanish governor started an all-out colonization effort in 1795, a Dutch nobleman, Baron de Bastrop, who was said to be fleeing the French Revolution, was given a grant of 36 square miles of land on June 21, 1796, by the Spanish crown. This grant contained practically all of Morehouse Parish with the exceptions of the southern portion and extreme northwestern corner. The grant also obligated Baron de Bastrop to bring in at least 500 families.

Large portions of this original grant were sold by the baron to Abram Morehouse. Between the years of 1805 and 1813, 90 people bought land from Abram Morehouse in tracts ranging from 30 to 10,000 acres. Morehouse Parish was born.

Today, Morehouse Parish is home to nearly 31,000 people. Bastrop is the parish seat of Morehouse Parish and is truly a community of vision. As you drive through the parish, you will see flourishing crops of corn, cotton, rice, soybeans and sweet potatoes. The scenic drives are breathtaking as you wind through the oak and pine trees along the bayous and swamps filled with cypress trees and hanging Spanish moss. Wildlife is in abundance here from the ground to the sky.

hat's what everyone who visits here says at some point. That something depends on your point of view and interests, but Lawrence has something for everybody.

Lawrence is one of the country's few cities founded purely for political reasons. The city was founded in 1854 by a group of Massachusetts abolitionists that arrived to settle the Kansas Territory in the name of freedom. That independence earned the new territory the moniker of Bleeding Kansas as those early settlers fought to determine the state's direction as a free or slave state, and established the area as an important locus in the Civil War.

Lawrence was home to early Kansas aviation when barnstormers came to town in 1911 to promote the thrill and pleasures of flying. In October 1929, the Lawrence Municipal Airport was dedicated at its current location, and it serves Kansas as the oldest continuously operating airport in the state.

The Lawrence Municipal Airport, front door from the sky, is in the final stages of a five-year, \$7 million facilities improvement program that has resulted in increased flight operations and aviation services to the 100,000 residents of Lawrence and Douglas County.

Flights for Life, based in Phoenix, AZ, is a unique organization created in 1984, partnered with United Blood Services, to resolve two serious health care problems—the time and distance in shipment of blood and blood products to and from small and/or remote medical facilities, and chronic blood shortages. The solution to these problems is the use of small aircraft capable of landing at smaller airports in all those communities, flown by volunteer pilots on an as needed basis, thus enabling optimum use of most blood components. In addition, Flights For Life volunteer pilots assist persons requiring treatment, and are available for transporting organs when necessary.
