

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Silver City

elcome to Silver City, once known as "La Ciénega de San Vicente," the Marsh of St. Vincent. Long before humans discovered this grasslands valley and natural springs (about 5000 B. C.), archeological turmoil spanning millions of years created what would be one of the country's richest mineralized areas.

Situated at 5,900 feet, the town has river valleys to the east and west, the Pinos Altos Range in the three million acre Gila National Forest to the north, the Burro Mountains to the southwest, and a high desert plain that stretches south toward

Mexico. Then, as now, Silver City's "four gentle seasons" (49/24°-Jan. & 87/59°-July) made it a desirable place to live.

Tribes of Mimbres Indians, a splinter group of the Mogollons, lived here from 900 A.D. until sometime near 1300 A.D., when they disappeared. The mystery of where these peaceful farmers went, or why they left houses intact, is unsolved. Fine examples of their traditional black-on-white pottery can be seen at Silver City's Western New Mexico University Museum.

Gold, discovered in 1860 (and again in 1866) in Pinos Altos, and silver discovered in 1870, a half mile west of where the Grant County Courthouse sits, brought waves of people seeking riches. Led by chiefs Mangas Coloradas, Gerónimo, Victorio, and Cochise, the Apache presence made living here more treacherous than in northern parts of New Mexico.

Fort Bayard, eight miles east of town, began in 1866 when Company B of the 125th U. S. Colored Infantry set up an encampment; one of four black regiments designed to protect stagecoach and wagon train routes from the Apaches. Twenty years later, Gerónimo surrendered at Skeleton Canyon, NM. The post was abandoned temporarily, then transferred to the Army medical department and became the first sanatorium dedicated to treatment of U.S. Army personnel suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis.

During the boom years, Hispanic settlers, experienced in mining techniques built homes, primarily of adobe, south of Spring Street on what became known as Chihuahua Hill. They built St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church in the 1870's. These settlers outnumbered the Anglo population, but the town was organized mainly by people who came from somewhere else. Nevertheless, most farmers and ranchers, and many businessmen during this period were of Hispanic descent. Ancient acequias continue to provide water for many ranches and farms in Grant County's 3,970 square miles. A sizable group of Chinese came by railroad, and established restaurants, laundries, groceries and the vegetable producing Chinese Gardens.

Around 1900, several floods carved a fifty-foot chasm, all the way to bedrock, where Main Street had been. Residents rebuilt in the same place until finally realizing they were fighting a losing battle. In recent years, the chasm has been transformed into the Big Ditch Park, an oasis for art shows, musical performances and strolling. Bullard Street, one block west, became the main thoroughfare and is lined with historic buildings which house numerous shops, galleries, restaurants, and two movie theaters.

The 14,000, or so, who call Silver City home, have a modern medical center, a university, two museums, two libraries, and a golf course within easy driving distance. An ongoing project, the Community Built Park, has been designed and is being built by children and volunteers. Modern hotels, four movie theaters, automobile dealers and services, supermarkets and other shopping venues complete a list of reasons why many are drawn to Silver City, and another 10,000 choose to live in surrounding Grant County.

Tourists come here for the Gila Cliff Dwellings National Monument; the Mimbres and Gila River valleys; the National Forest Service's Catwalk in the White Water Canyon at Glenwood; and the ancient Indian camping grounds at the City of Rocks.

Built in the early 1950's, Silver City-Grant County Airport is the area's only public airport, and has published instrument approaches. Members of the Grant County Mercy Fliers Pilots Association, formed in 1955, were instrumental in building two of the other four private county runways, Turner Ridgeport and Whiskey Creek Airport, both of which started as dirt strips.

For decades, the mercy fliers conducted three or more searches a year throughout the mountainous regions of southwest New Mexico. The organization evolved into the Grant County Pilots Association with a dozen members and ten aircraft. GCPA will award its first scholarship this year, to a student pursuing a career in aviation. We say "Buenos dias." Thank you for coming to Silver City. We hope you enjoy your stay.

Las Vegas (& San Miguel County)

as Vegas and San Miguel County, located in scenic northern New Mexico, combine natural beauty, unique architecture, exquisite arts and interesting people. Las Vegas boasts more than 900 buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The unique beauty found among the local architecture is impressive. Buildings range from New Mexico-style adobe homes scattered all along the Santa Fe Trail to Victorian buildings constructed after the arrival of the Santa Fe Railroad in 1879. If anything can top Las Vegas' architectural splendor it is San Miguel County's natural beauty. With mountains and valleys, mesas and canyons, marshes



and green belts, northern New Mexico contains some of the most beautiful and unique landscape in the state. Las Vegas is a close-knit community. The people are friendly and share a strong sense of tradition and deep pride in their history and heritage. Las Vegas isn't "southwestern chic," it is 100 percent authentic.

Climate

With four distinct seasons, the weather is surprisingly mild. Humidity poses no problem in San Miguel County. The high desert air is dry, clear and clean. The sun shines most days and skies are clear and star-filled almost every night.

Art & Culture

Las Vegas is often considered a living museum. A stroll through town can turn into a cultural event. Las Vegas' city library is housed in the only surviving Carnegie Library in New Mexico. The Las Vegas City Museum and Rough Rider Memorial Collection displays the area's rich history and features Rough Rider memorabilia such as uniforms and photos from the Spanish-American War. New Mexico Highlands University's Ofeld Auditorium, one of the state's architectural gems, is the site of many theatrical and musical productions.

Las Vegas and San Miguel County celebrate history and culture with frequent festivals, fiestas and fairs such as the Santa Fe Trail Heritage Days, 4th of July Fiestas and Places with a Past Historical Building Tour. Because of the growing number of artists in the area many art shows and tours are held throughout the year.

Recreation

Recreational opportunities abound in San Miguel County. Glorious countryside, including national forest lands, provide opportunities to camp, hike, fish and enjoy winter sports. Conchas Lake and Storrie Lake are popular places to go fishing, boating, windsurfing or water skiing.

The City of Las Vegas Recreation Center offers a variety of activities and sports clinics, most geared toward youth. The center includes a recreation pool and health center. The City plans to expand this facility to include racketball and basketball courts.

If you enjoy spectator sports, New Mexico Highlands University offers football, basketball, volleyball, softball, baseball and track & field.

Education

New Mexico Highlands University is a liberal arts school with graduate and undergraduate degree programs in arts and sciences, business, education, and social work. Luna Vocational Technical Institute and Community College has both certificated and associate degree programs. The Armand Hammer United World College of the American West, a two year baccalaurate degree program, is also located in the Las Vegas area.

Denver on the high plains of
eastern Colorado, lies the
progressive city of Burlington. With
its nearly level 4100-foot elevation
in the heart of deep well irrigation,
Burlington is the county seat of Kit
Carson County and serves as an
active trade center for the regions
diverse agricultural activities.

Burlington's aggressive economic efforts coupled with its concern for growth with harmony, enables it to provide its 3500 plus residents with an impressive standard of living and economic future.

Burlington is also home to the Kit Carson County Carousel. The carousel was made by the Philadelphia Toboggan Company in 1905 and is the oldest operational carousel in existence. The 46 hand

carved wooden animals march to the tunes of a Wurlitzer Monster Military Band Organ. The restoration completed in 1988, the Kit Carson County Carousel is now a National Historic Landmark.


Old Town

onca City is a great place to visit. There is a lot of Oklahoma history in this area. Ponca City was thriving in the oil boom days during the 1920's. During that period when oil was gushing from the soil, E.W. Marland, oil baron, built two historic homes.

Marland's Grand Home was Marland's first home and is a 22 room, white stucco mansion that houses museums.

The second home built by E.W. Marland is a 55 room "Castle on the Prairie". Five lakes and an Olympic size, cloverleaf swimming pool, once surrounded it. It is a mysterious home. Cold and dark with tunnels and back rooms. A tour is provided that allows visitors to see some of the secrets of the castle as the guide tells some of the bittersweet and unsual stories of E.W. Marland. Also included in the tour are Lyde's Cottage and the Artist Studio.

Ponca City has Lake Ponca also. This is a city lake and provides water to the community. Boating, fishing, sailing, and jet skiing are allowed, however, swimming is not. Ponca Lake has camping facilities and parks. Lake Ponca Park has shelter houses for reunions, parties, picnics, meetings and such, a duck pond, and a wonderful park full of toys for the kids. Lake Park is also part of the decorated area for Festival of Angels. Lake Ponca is surrounded on the North side by the beautiful Lew Wentz Golf Course and Lew Wentz Camp and Swimming Pool that over looks the lake.




The Pioneer Woman Statue is located in Ponca City. On the grounds is the Pioneer Woman Museum. A unique building shaped like the Pioneer Woman's sunbonnet. The museum is dedicated to women who have pioneered the way in many different ways.

Ponca City has Standing Bear Park that displays a 22-foot bronze statue of Standing Bear, a Native American from the Ponca Tribe. At the base of the statue is the "Circle of Life" that honors the six Native American Tribes surrounding Ponca City. In the center of the Circle is the Reflecting Pool. These are all Native American symbols. At the base of the Circle is a podium that when the button is pushed tells the story of Standing Bear. The park has a pond that is in the shape of an arrowhead that is significant to the story of Standing Bear. In September, the park hosts the Standing Bear Pow Wow.





Winnsboro



ocated in the upper Piedmont region of South Carolina, Fairfield County, with its rolling hills and fertile valleys, is well-known for its picturesque scenery.

The county is also known for its "pines, ponds and pastures," and as a place for people to enjoy living in a serene country atmosphere.

The county is steeped in history and populated by people proud of their heritage. Fairfield County has more than 100 historical buildings, churches and homes. And scattered throughout the county are monuments and memories that speak of the unique traditions and culture of the area and the Upcountry.

Situated between the Broad River on the west and the Wateree River (now Lake Wateree) on the east, the area was hunting ground for several Indian tribes. Arrowheads and pieces of Native American pottery can still be found on the banks of these bodies of water.

The first settler to come to the area was Thomas Nightingale. His love of horses drew him in 1740 to a "cow-pen" establishment about five miles from where a town began.

"Winnsborough," settled on land owned by the Winn family, was a community of about 20 houses when it was occupied during the Revolutionary War by British soldiers under Lord Cornwallis. The British camped in the town from October 1780 to January 1781. Richard Winn,

John Winn and John Vanderhost led "Winnsborough" to be chartered in 1785 and designated the seat of justice for the Fairfield District.

The name of the town was changed to "Winnsboro" and it was incorporated in 1832.

Fairfield County has numerous churches, some of which have been in existence for more than 200 years. Ridgeway, the second largest town in the county, originally was known as "New Town." The name was changed when the owners of the Charlotte and South Carolina Railway decided not to build the railroad on the Camden route but to use the "ridge way."

Winnsboro blue granite, "The Silk of the Trade," is used worldwide in buildings and monuments.

The excellent hunting and fishing that Native Americans enjoyed still exist today. Fairfield County, with an abundance of deer and wild turkeys, is a focal point for sportsmen.

The economy has been given a boost in recent years by other industries such as Salant-Manhattan, Mack Trucks, Plastech and Fuji-Copian.

This growth is part of the never-ending story of Fairfield County.






Portsmouth

trolling around one of the oldest working harbors in the country, visitors and residents alike can expect to see a wide range of ships passing by the famous Seawall, a scenic walkway on the banks of the Elizabeth River. Here in Portsmouth you can browse delightful museums; shop at boutiques, galleries and antique stores along High Street; take a harbor tour aboard the Carrie B; dine at Olde Towne restaurants which range from quiet cafes specializing in coffees and freshly baked pastries to upscale eateries offering some of the region's best seafood dishes or take a walking tour or trolley tour through historic Olde Towne.

Steeped in over 300 years of history, Portsmouth offers a variety of historic districts featuring homes with a rich




Established in 1752, Portsmouth is a small seaport city that has managed to hold on to its 18th and 19th century history and charm for nearly 250 years. Still standing is the original downtown intersection that the city's founder, Col. William Crawford, dedicated to public use - one corner each for a church, a market, a courthouse, and a jail. In fact, the Episcopal church on that corner – founded in 1762 – still rings its bells across the street from the 1846 Courthouse that now serves as a museum.

Portsmouth is a mix of the old and new. The TodiMusicFest will début in Olde Towne Portsmouth July 18-28, 2002, in concurrence with the City's ongoing 250th anniversary celebration. Portsmouth will assume the role of host to America's only international "sister-city" music festival, which is aligned culturally and artistically with central Italy's historic Umbrian city of Todi. Blessed by the Irish Tenors in its first concert in

July 2001, Portsmouth's NTELOS Pavilion at Harbor Center, the cultural arts amphitheater, is the latest addition to the city's revitalized waterfront.

For other venues, you can take a ride on Hampton Roads Transit's charming paddlewheel pedestrian ferry for a short trip across the harbor to Norfolk and experience The Waterside Festival Marketplace. Portsmouth is also a short distance from other area attractions, such as the Virginia Marine Science Museum in Virginia Beach, the Virginia Air and Space Center in Hampton, and The Mariners' Museum in Newport News. Or step back into early American history by visiting Williamsburg, Jamestown and Yorktown, the cradle of colonial culture and American independence.
