
Temecula Valley residents and tourists enjoy mountain, ocean and desert resort amenities, with year around golf, tasting tours of the wineries, visiting Old Town, and several lakes to fish and water ski. Temecula is home to the annual Balloon & Wine festival, a two-day event highlighted by the spectacular ascension of colorful hot air ballons and wine tasting from their eleven award-winning wineries. 



Las Vegas

Las Vegas, meaning "the meadows" truly lives up to its name. The breathtaking scenery will capture your eyes ... and your heart. Situated at the foot of the Sangre de Cristo mountains, Las Vegas was established in 1835 by a group of 15 Spanish families who petitioned the Mexican Government for a grant. Hence, this beautiful city was born. With a population of over 15,600, Las Vegas boasts a city filled with friendly people, lots of special events, 900 buildings on the national historic register, and beautiful architecture, to name just a few.

The Montezuma Castle is one such place. Once used as a seminary for Jesuits, the area is currently home of the Armand Hammer United World College of the American West. Two hundred students from around the world enroll at the college in hopes of earning an International Baccalaureate Degree. The castle is over 100 years old. Many visitors to our area are intrigued by the area and its history. Mr. Hammer is currently planning to renovate the castle to a livable state.

Storrie Lake State Park, built in 1916, was thought to cater mostly to the fisherman, but in recent years has become a statewide attraction. The sport that attracts so many visitors is called windsurfing and, has become a very popular sporting

event. Few lakes have the constant wind that is necessary for the sport. On the average, the wind blows 6 days a week at Storrie Lake with winds of at least 15 mph on four of these days. Lessons for beginners and advanced sailors, sailboards and wetsuits are available.

The Las Vegas Municipal Airport was the site for Lyle Shelton's Bearcat "Rare Bear" on August 18, 19 and 20, 1989. The modified post-World War II Bearcat Grumman F8F-2 fighter plane was made in 1948. The plane was developed at the end of WWII but did not see military action until Korea. Lyle is a retired Navy pilot, commander, TWA airline pilot, and race pilot. He indicated that he would like to have about 20 planes in Las Vegas to compete in a future air show. The area is excellent for the speed runs because of the elevation and climate. The thin air mixed with the warm temperatures help these planes fly faster.

As you see, the area has many things to offer. As we've said before, once here you won't want to leave.

ELK CITY

Elk City, a community of approximately 12,500 friendly people, is located in western Oklahoma and has an average of three hundred forty three flying days per year. The airport is located on the Northeast corner of town and has a concrete runway that is four thousand feet long and seventy five feet wide. The runway construction was completed in 1979. The services available include Avgas and let fuel, a Certified Repair Station, Charter flight instruction and rental and hangar space.

The Airport Commission establishes policies and makes recommendations to the City Council

and Mayor concerning the operation of the facility. The airport is managed by Jack and Betty Womack. Jack and Betty will be on hand to welcome the participants of the Air Race and assist them on obtaining the services that they might need.

The airport property contains approximately 240 acres and is located approximately 12 nautical miles from the Sayre VOR 115.2. The EZY locator beacon is located at the airport on the frequency of 241.

BELLEVILLE

Founded in 1869, Belleville, Kansas was named after the Belleville Transit Company, with a population of approximately 3,000, is beautifully situated on high just rolling upland. Belleville copywrited the slogan "At the Crossroads of America" in 1926 as it lies at the junction of US 81 and US 36 Highways. It has events with national, state and regional focus to offer year round, as well as a central location for visitors and tourists.

Nationally recognized by outdoor magazines as a prime pheasant and deer hunting location in America.

Sporting the fastest half-mile dirt race track in the nation and is home for the Miller High Life Midget Nationals each August during the North Central Kansas Free Fair.

In June, the Crossroads Car Festival, has more than 250 exhibitors of antique, classic, custom and hot rod cars. Youth are an important part of everyday life and for more than half a century Belleville residents and businessmen have played host for the Kansas Junior Miss Pageant.

Step back into the past at the Republic County Historical Museum located just off of US 36, which has a restored church, school, log cabin and new building filled with historical facts.

The Pawnee Indian Village, just a short distance from Belleville, a nationally recognized historic site, takes visitors back to the time when Indians and buffalo roamed the plains.

Just recently the Rock Island Railroad Company deeded an old pond that was used for years as a water supply for the old type steam engines which lies on 48 acre tract to the city and is being developed into a great recreational area.



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MT. VERNON Illinois


Mt. Vernon is conveniently located in the heart of Southern Illinois at the juncture of Interstates 57 and 64, and has a population of approximately 17,500. Mt. Vernon is the seat of Jefferson County, which was established in 1819. Abraham Lincoln campaigned in Mt. Vernon on behalf of "Tippecanoe" Harrison, in 1840. "Honest Abe" earned his highest legal fee, in 1859 when he represented the Illinois Central Railroad in a tax case heard by the state supreme court in Mt. Vernon, known now as the Appellate Court House. The Appellate



Court House was constructed in 1857 and is located at 14th and Main Streets.

Mt. Vernon is home to the Mitchell Museum, a prime source of cultural enrichment not only for Mt. Vernon and Jefferson County, but for the entire Southern Illinois area. Visitors will find hiking paths, a bird sanctuary, the Cedarhurst Art Center, a 19th century restored village and the Cedarhurst Braill Trail for the sight impaired. The nationally renown Cedarhurst Craft Fair is held every year on the second week of September.

Other events are the All American Salute to Freedom in honor of the 4th of July, and the annual Sweetcorn and Watermelon Festival held in August.

St. Louis. It has two paved runways, 5/23-6,500' and 15/33-3150'. Our field provides a full service FBO with

Pan-Am weather system, AWOS III, VOR and ILS approaches, terminal building, storage hangars, and a Fire/Rescue Station. The spacious terminal building was completed in 1977. It houses modern facilities for passenger check in and arrival, a full service restaurant and lounge, airport offices, and meeting rooms. The Mt. 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York - "Our Nation's First Capitol"



Come sample the spices of York County – scenery and history, activities and festivities, food and fun, whatever you are looking for – York's got it all!

York's rich historical tradition is "peppered" with many noteworthy events. America has its origins embedded in Pennsylvania, for it was York that the First Continental Congress called home from September 1777 to June 1778. This is where the Continental congress managed the country's affairs and made decisions that shaped the entire nation.

If the Founding Fathers were to return to York today, they would recognize the reconstructed Colonial Courthouse and the restored Golden Plough Tavern, but little else. Opened for settlement in 1736 through an agreement between William Penn's heirs and the Susquehannocks, York County attracted industrious German, Scotch, Irish, and English settlers. By 1900, York thrived as a steam-powered industrial town.







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FALLBROOK COMMUNITY AIRPARK

2141 S. Mission Road, Fallbrook, California 92028

Fallbrook Community Airpark is one of the few, if not the only airport built since World War II which has not received any financial assistance from any Federal, State or County agency. Initial funding was provided through donations and a lot of hard work by the pioneers of Fallbrook Community Airpark.

In 1959 a small group of pilots were flying out of adjacent airports, namely Oceanside and a small private strip located in what is now San Marcos. These airports were at least 30 minutes drive from Fallbrook. They, along with several businessmen and institutions, believed that the Fallbrook area needed an airport. By 1960 it was felt that the best site would be a high ridge just south and east of the town. However, the property belonged to the U.S. Navy and they were not interested in leasing it. After long negotiations, it was conceived that the Navy would deed the property to the County of San Diego and the County would in turn lease it to a non-profit corporation formed by local citizens solely for the purpose of building an airport. The only stipulation in the Navy's deed would be that the property always remain with an airport on it or the entire parcel would revert to the Navy.


Finally, in April 1963 the San Diego County Board of Supervisors accepted the deed from the Navy. It took until September 8, 1963, for the 50 year lease from the County to the corporation to be hammered out. In September 1964 the Fallbrook Community Airpark Board of Directors started construction. The County had estimated a cost of approximately \$100,000 for the first stage. The people of Fallbrook did it for \$25,000! The first landing on the new airport was made on October 28, 1964. For about 4

years the airport struggled financially, but through agricultural and recreational leases the airport has come to sound financial standing.

In April of 1968 Fallbrook Air Service, the first and only full service FBO, was opened for business by the Aberle family. Today, that same FBO remains, and a hangar service facility is about to open.

Today, the general consensus from both airport users and the Airpark Board of Directors is that this small airport has and will continue to serve the aviation loving pilots of this community quite well.
