

Boise, Idaho

Welcomes the 21st Air Race Classic Pilots

Boise is a place that feels like everyone's hometown. A city nestled along the pristine Boise river where the desert meets the Rocky Mountains and was given birth by hard working visionary pioneers who saw that the plentiful waters of the Boise River would be the pulse of the community. These waters helped to turn the desert into a lush oasis where trees now line the boulevards and lend a sense of grace to the safe lifestyle. Quality of life is a tradition of the past and a continuing goal of the future. Boise is a city touched by the four seasons but always with moderation. With a widely diverse economy, Boise is a city where people live because they choose to; the city where the quality of life is testimony to an urban center at peace with its natural surroundings.

Founded in 1863, Boise now has a population of 250,000, famous for its scenic beauty, abundant wildlife and

recreational opportunities and of course the 'Potato'.

The Idaho Air National Guard which has always held a major role in Idaho aviation began in 1946 as the 190th Fighter Squadron, Single engine.

Idaho has three major Universities and several state colleges. Rick Heib, who was a mission specialist on the 1992 NASA shuttle flight STS-39 graduated from Northwest Nazarene College just a few miles from Boise. Barbara Morgan, also an Idaho resident and the next Teacher in Space teaches in a small rural school in North central Idaho.

Idaho also rates high in Women's events beginning with the internationally acclaimed 'Power Bar International Women's Challenge'. This is an 11 day premier event in women's cycling. Also nationally acclaimed is our 'Women's Fitness Celebration' which has turned out to be the nation's largest, women only, run/walk event and is open to women of all ages and abilities.

The Boise River Festival, held each June, has won numerous 'gold' awards and is rated as one of the top 10 Summer Festivals in the United States.

Idaho also has more miles of 'White Water' than any other state in the lower forty eight. The 'River of No Return' along with others is floated annually by thousands of those brave in heart all the while experiencing the majestic mountains or even fishing for the Cutthroat trout, our state fish.

While visiting neighboring counties, you may want to see Idaho City which was the largest town in the Northwest back in 1865. It remains from the gold rush era and is a preserved relic of the bustling, brawling, boomtown days. It has the state's oldest newspaper (The Idaho World). There are still remains of the territorial Jail and Boot Hill Cemetary on the outskirts of town with grave markers that speak of the real pioneers of this once very prosperous town of the west.

Vintage Wine from Idaho's many winerys or Vintage Rodeos await you in nearby Canyon County. Sky Star Aircraft and the Avid Flyer are both manufacturing companies with a variety of versions of these small, durable, efficient airplanes. They along with the WarHawk Air Museum which is especially fascinating to the WWII enthusiast can all be found just minutes from Boise. Albertson's College and Northwest Nazarene College also plan an important role in the economy of this colorful county. The Snake River Stampede is held annually and draws professional cowboys from coast to challenge their skills at everything a Nationally rated rodeo can offer.

If you travel a little south/southeast of Boise to Owyhee or Elmore County, you will experience Ghost towns, Sand Dunes and Horned toads along with Mountain Home Airforce Base which is home to the Air Force's first and only Air Intervention Composite Wing.. This is a striking contrast to the serenity of this area and seeing the tallest free standing sand dunes in North America, The Bruneau Sand dunes.

Traveling Northwest, will bring you to Cherry Blossoms and Rainbow trout in Gem County, alongside the Payette River in a small valley brimming with orchards and varied terrain and is the home of the world famous 'Old Time Fiddler's contest'.

Then there is Breakfast in Luxury and Dinner in the Wilderness all experienced from Valley County, the beginning of a summer and winter wonderland.

POTATO FACTS!

estled in the southern foothills of the Black Hills in Weston County, Wyoming is Newcastle. Once part of a great inland sea, its only inhabitants were the great dinosaurs which lie buried in the pine draped slopes and sprawling grasslands of today's high plains. When the sea disappeared and the hills rose up like an island in a sea of grass, early man from the Paleo-Indian culture wandered in search of shaggy bison.


Once part of the Great Sioux Reserve, Weston County attracted mountain men who came in search of its fur bearing creatures and its solitude. In 1874, Gen. Armstrong Custer traversed the county and discovered gold nearby.

The railroad came through and with it, civilization was born in the City of Newcastle. Just to the north lies the ruins of Cambria, a company town peopled by minors and their families, immigrants from 23 nations. Homesteaders settled the plains and more than a few lost their dreams to the Dust Bowl years.

The Newcastle area is living monument to America's pioneers and the spirit which built the West. Among the beautiful scenery of the Black Hills and wide open plains are the nearby attractions of Mt. Rushmore, Devil's Tower, Jewels Cave, and Custer State Park. Many people come to the area to explore dinosaur excavations, snowmobile, ski, fish, try their hand at horseback riding or ranch work, or just take in the view, but all leave with a sense of what it must have been like when the first humans arrived and gazed at the areas unspoiled beauty.

Duluth, Minnesota

Duluth is located at the western tip of Lake Superior, the largest, coldest, clearest and deepest of the Great Lakes. Although situated in the very center of the North American continent, Duluth is a major world seaport, visited annually by ocean vessels from over 20 nations. Interlake cargoes of iron, grain, coal and stone combine to make Duluth-Superior the Great Lakes' largest volume port.

Commentator Paul Harvey described Duluth as "... seagulls and sailboats, thousand-foot ships ... sand beaches ... parks and playgrounds, two 27-hole public golf courses, two 18-hole private courses, ... recreation centers, hiking and biking and walleye fishing right downtown. In the wintertime, ... skiing and snowmobiling, ice fishing and dog sledding ... a magic time of ballet and symphony, ... accelerated activity of art, entertainment, and cultural centers." Duluth is all of this and a whole lot more.

Five major medical facilities and many public and private health care facilities improve the quality of life for the young and old, while students of the public and private schools combine with local campuses of the University of Minnesota, College of St. Scholastica, Lake Superior College and Duluth Business University to consistently test well above national and state averages.

Duluth International Airport is a full service airport with 24-hour air traffic control, radar and instrument approach systems. It has Minnesota's longest runway at 11,000 feet, and a 5,700 foot secondary runway. It is home to Cirrus Design, a general aviation aircraft design and manufacturing firm and Northwest Airlines' Airbus Maintenance Facility. Pilots also frequent the paved and lighted Sky Harbor land and float plane airport in the Harbor area.

A drive on Lake Superior's scenic North Shore, a visit to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area, Voyageurs National Park and the Superior National Forest all enhance a quality of life that is hard to beat.



Elkhart, Indiana

Ikhart is the center of much of the culture, history, commerce and manufacturing of the area. With a population of 44,000, Elkhart is home to a diverse collection of people, institutions and businesses. This area was first visited by French missionaries, traders and explorers over three hundred years ago, and was part of New France until it was given to England after the French and Indian War. It became part of the United States following the end of the Revolutionary War in 1783. Indiana was recognized as a state in 1816. As Elkhart neared the end of the 19th century, it even boasted an architect of international experience and fame, Mr. E. Hill Turnock. Turnock, a protégé of Frank Lloyd Wright, came home to Elkhart and spent his career building homes, office buildings, schools, and other structures, including many that still stand today.

The Elkhart of today is known throughout the nation as the home of the recreational vehicle, or "RV" industry. Campers, trailers and motorhomes from the industry's leading manufacturers leave Elkhart by the tens of thousands each year, headed for highways and campgrounds all over North America. Elkhart is also the center of the van conversion business, and is often regarded as the place where the modern manufactured housing industry was founded.

Other industries of international importance usually put the little town of Elkhart on the map long before the birth of the RV industry. Bayer, formerly known as Miles, Inc., makers of One-A-Day vitamins, Alka-Seltzer, Bactine, and a wide range of other health care products, was founded in Elkhart, and is still one of the County's largest private employers. For generations, band and orchestra members all over the world have trusted musical instruments made right here in Elkhart. Trumpets, flutes, clarinets and trombones with names like Selmer, Bach, Conn, King, and many others come from the hands of highly skilled craftspeople working in shops in the Elkhart area.

The beautiful St. Joe River provides all the people of Elkhart with a peaceful, picturesque backdrop to everyday life in a busy town. In winter, it is an important refuge for wintering ducks looking for open water. In spring, the cool water is often blanketed with a white layer of fog. At the height of summer, boaters and skiers take over the water, and during the fall, the water comes alive with color, reflecting the reds, golds and browns of the trees that line the shores.

Wheeling, West Virginia



Wheeling's historical ties to women aviators can be traced back to 1927, when Wheeling sponsored the famed aviatrix Ruth Elier's New York to Paris flight in an aircraft named "the American Girl, Wheeling USA". Her attempt to become the first woman to fly across the Atlantic ended after being aloft for thirty-six hours and flying over 2,600 miles. Unfortunately, due to low oil pressure, the aircraft was forced to ditch in the ocean. Ruth was rescued by a Dutch freighter and went on to receive a heroine's welcome in Paris. You can see an exhibit devoted to Ruth Elder in the Airport's Terminal Museum, which takes on a rich and unique historical aviation atmosphere.

Ohio County boasts an outstanding quality of life. It is one of the nation's lowest crime rate areas. Ohio County is the cultural center of the Northern Ohio River Valley. Its nationally ranked school system, exceptional health care facilities, glorious public parks, grand Victorian neighborhoods, and rich ethnic heritage together make Ohio County special.

Welcome to Knoxville, Tennessee!

noxville's McGhee Tyson Airport is celebrating its 60th anniversary as East Tennessee's hometown connection to the world. During the past 10 years, travelers using McGhee Tyson have increased 55 percent. To meet the demands of a growing community, the Knoxville Airport Authority plans an extensive terminal renovation project scheduled for completion in 2001. The airport offers one-stop service to the world with non-stop service to 14 destinations and same-plane service to 16 others. In 1996, over 1.4 million passengers traveled through McGhee Tyson Airport.
